
There is no secretary's report for a March 1 member's meeting at Ray & Robin's as it was canceled due to inclement weather

2023 Entrance Gate Procedure

The gate code has been updated for 2023...so it's important for folks to renew their membership soon to be able to enjoy the spring flying that's right around the corner!

MONDAY THRU FRIDAY - We are permitted to keep the gate swung open while we are flying from 8:00AM to 4:00PM. Last one out closes and locks the gate.

ON WEEKENDS - The gate must be swung closed but left unlocked by putting the chain over the gate.

In either situation make sure the padlock itself <u>is locked</u> on the chain so it does not disappear. Thanks!
