Board of Directors Meeting

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 6 AT RAY & ROBIN'S HOBBY CENTER

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: David Dyer, Jim McCoy, Ed Ricker, Simon Willcox, Elliott Randall, Tony Blanchard, Jeff Beuttell, Spike Enck and Bill Lairsey.

CALLTO ORDER: 5:28PM

Board Meeting Minutes: All board members present voted to accept the February 7th board minutes as submitted.

Treasurer's Report: Ed reviewed February 2024 financial statement. He clarified the AMA cost as corrected to \$215. Reported 37 active members for 2024 as of the end of February. The February 2024 financial statement was approved as amended.

Secretary's Report: Simon reviewed his initial brief communication with Preble Street regarding the possibility of the club sponsoring a youth who has an interest in piloting. It was suggested the Boys & Girls Club of America and Big Brothers Big Sisters of America may be of help. Simon will make contact with these organization in the near future.

President's Report: David presented material on an AMA event called "Sky Battle 2024" which is a flight duration contest using "Bagged Slip-Together Balsa Airplane Kit That Come With Wheels." This is a "Postal" event where contestants sign-up, compete and email results. The contest runs from April 26th to May 5th, 2024 with information on the AMA website. David also suggested the club establish a committee to head youth education and recruitment in schools and communities.

OLD BUSINESS

Bill Lairsey submitted his written overview of the club's basic pilot training program for review and comment.

- Minimal training requirements to become "Solo: certified."
- Focus on safety and basic control of the flying apparatus.
- Bill discussed the use of the "SAFE" and "AS3X" systems.
- Both systems are excellent training assist solutions, however the trainee should be weened of the "SAFE" as it could become a "crutch" and inhibit the move to more complex planes that do not have such a system.
- Elliot discussed the need to just let the trainee fly the plane to understand how it reacts to control inputs and environmental conditions. He indicated emphasis on flying pattens should not be ignored, parallel flight, altitude and speed consistency and bank angles depending on wind conditions.
- It was asked if there were AMA or club training equipment recommendations.
- Carbon Cub S2 and Apprentice seem to be the most popular and are wonderful planes for new pilot training.
- The club has buddy boxes for Spektrum radios. However if someone wishes to be trained on another brand they would need to provide both the master and buddy-box radios.
- Club does have a couple of nitro-powered trainers. However, in recent years most choose to use electric-powered apparatus.

The remaining 2024 club events were scheduled, with the Swap Meet confirmed for April 28th (rain or shine).

David stated that the 2024 AMA club charter renewal application has been completed and submitted.

Spike confirmed we should not expect an elaborate document package from the AMA/FAA for FRIA approval of the Kiwanis Beach location as it is not within controlled area of a airport as is the case with our Green Road field.

NEW BUSINESS

CALL TO ORDER: 6:32PM

January Meeting Minutes: David called for approval of the submitted minutes for the February 7, 2024 meeting. The minutes were approved as submitted.

OLD BUSINESS

Reviewed the training documentation Bill Lairsey submitted.

- Minimal training requirements to become "Solo: certified."
- Focus on safety and basic control of the flying apparatus.
- Once completed and approved the document will be posted at the field.

The remaining 2024 club events were scheduled, with the Swap Meet confirmed for April 28th (rain or shine).

David stated that the 2024 AMA club charter renewal application has been completed and submitted.

David reiterated the information Spike had offered in the board meeting with regards to the expected documentation package and confirmed the application had been completed and submitted.

NEW BUSINESS

David stated he would like to establish a subcommittee to lead the youth recruitment and education initiative. We will need to follow-up on this with email and maybe a survey to the membership to determine the interest level.

- Reviewed the AMA Sky Battle 2024 information presented in the Board meeting. David stated he paid \$21 for two balsa stick planes but likely could be purchased for less cost in quantity.

- It was suggested we have club table and accept saleable donations such that the proceeds benefit the club coffers.

David reviewed Remote ID discussion from the board meeting.

- No need for the device at either club flying fields.
- Should flying at another location be wanted there are apps that can be used to enter the location information and receive real time approval. Aloft, AirAware and OpenSky are examples. Enter location, envelope of flying area and tine window for event and submit for approval. Response is in minutes. Can also be used for club events that might occur at no club locations such as school fields, gymnasiums etc.
- Remote ID device if needed can be purchased for \$100, can run on 9V or equipment battery.

Simon will be investigating the equipment and setup required to host "hybrid" meetings such that members could join remotely to participate.



MEETING SHOW & TELL

Dan Desena's DC-3 Project

If you're a regular reader of the *Bullsheet*, you may remember that Dan Desena has been working on an electric-powered DC-3 project for a while now. His focus early-on was fabricating a set of custom retractable landing gear for the model that closely resembled the full-scale plane in both appearance and function. After a fair amount of trial-and-error (and learning new skills like brazing), Dan was successful in getting the gear to operate as hoped.

With the time he spent on the landing gear, we were all surprised to see him arrive at the March meeting with a completed and just about ready-to-fly plane!

Built from a Dare kit designed by Pat Tritle, the model has a 60-inch wingspan and sports two electric motors with counter-rotating propellers. Dan covered the model with Polyspan sealed with Polycrylic by Minwax and then painted it to match a beautiful Air Lingus aircraft that was restored after serving originally with the Royal Air Force late in World War II.

Needless to say, we are all anxious to see the model in the air and we wish Dan the best of luck with his maiden flight!

When are You Flying?

Over the past couple of seasons, several members have been utilizing a phone app called *Whatsapp Messenger* to let others know when they are going to the field. It seems to work well, so we are suggesting that interested members consider signing-up for the app and give it a try. It's free to download from the Google Play Store for Android and the App Store for iPhones.

Entrance Gate Procedure

ON WEEKENDS - The gate must be swung closed but left unlocked by putting the chain over the gate.

In either situation, make sure the padlock itself is locked on the chain so it does not disappear. Thanks!
