On August 9, we successfully renewed our Gold Leader Club status with the Academy of Model Aeronautics. To be considered a Gold Leader Club, we must meet the following six criteria:

- 1. Clubs must have been chartered by AMA for a minimum of five years.
- 2. Club membership must be open to all AMA members and not limited to a certain number.
- 3. Clubs must develop and post Safety and Operational Rules at their flying sites.

4. Clubs must file a copy of Safety and Operational Rules at AMA

5. A club's flying field must have separate areas for fliers and spectators, clearly marked as such.

6. The AMA Safety Code must be posted and visible at the club field.

If you see Cole at the field in the next few weeks, please be sure to give him kudos for a job well done!


Flying Field Update

A big thank you to Elliott Randall for taking time away from flying to tackle some of the heavy overgrowth that was sprouting up along the runway earlier this summer. The thistles, in particular, were getting pretty robust and could significantly dam-

age any aircraft that happened to wander into them. Elliot's secret weapon was a powerful, long-reach weed-whacker fitted with a very sharp saw blade. A traditional string trimmer would have been no match for this heavy growth as the thistle stalks were quite thick and very woody.

There's also talk about taking another "whack" at the recent growth adjacent to the first pilot station

to open up the view of the field from the clubhouse.



We'd also like to report that it appears the vole population has been kept at bay so far this season thanks to the work party efforts in the spring and Dan DeSena's on-going "vole mace" treatments. Those little critters can cause a great deal of damage to the field turf if left unchecked. So, it is vital that we keep a lookout for any new evidence of their activity.

JUST A REMINDER

Entrance Gate Procedure

MONDAY THRU FRIDAY - We are permitted to keep the gate swung open while we are flying from 8:00AM to 4:00PM. Last one out closes and locks the gate.

ON WEEKENDS - The gate must be swung closed but left unlocked by putting the chain over the gate.

In either situation make sure the padlock itself is locked on the chain so it does not disappear. Thanks!
