CALL TO ORDER: 6:00PM

Members Minutes: David called for approval of the member meeting minutes for March 5, 2025. The minutes were approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report:

Ed reviewed the March 2025 financial statement and it was approved as submitted. Current member roster stands at 35 senior members.

Secretary's Report: There was no secretary's report.

President's Comments: David opened the meeting with hopes for better weather soon so we can all get back to flying. He mentioned his desire for a more successful season for himself and that remaining positive in the hobby was very important, especially when in the learning stages.

He also commented that the field conditions made him doubtful about our planned clean-up day on April 12. We'll make a determination prior to the planned date and let members know if we will move to the back-up date of April 19. Bruce Morse offered the use of his tractor as he has done for several seasons.

David acknowledged the arrival of two guests for the evening who were invited by Dave Cyr.

OLD BUSINESS

Club Promotion Jim McCoy distributed final printed pieces for our community bulletin board promo card. These 4x6 cards are available for all members to place on bulletin boards at supermarkets, drug stores, libraries or town offices...wherever community information is available for the public to see. Each card has our website, Facebook address and a QR code linked to our website. Various aircraft types are shown on the front and a brief description of our club is on the back. Packs of five cards each were passed out to members at the meeting. Thanks went to Dan DeSena for making the suggestion.

An inventory of the approved

magazine stickers were also distributed. These are to affix to the front of AMA magazines to then be placed at local businesses where magazines are in waiting rooms.

Jim also reviewed his efforts in connecting with other local area RC clubs in an attempt to share information about events. He discussed the content of a test email sent to ten such club contacts and the positive feedback he has received. His initial contact included our Swap Meet flyer.

NEW BUSINESS

Maine ACE Academy Camp: David reviewed our involvement with the Maine ACE Academy and their annual ACE Camp event at Propsnappers Field. The ACE Academy promotes involvement in aviation to high school age kids throughout Maine. As one of their many aviation experiences over their two-week camp, Bill Lairsey has provided information about RC flying and buddy-box time for this interested group of campers for many seasons. We have scheduled Thursday, August 7 as our ACE Academy date and would love some help on that day. Please contact Bill Lairsey for information.

AMA District 1 Outreach: David reported on his experience sitting-in on a recent Zoom meeting arranged by AMA District 1. This was the second of two meetings to discuss how the AMA can best assist the individual clubs in our particular district in terms of expanding membership and coordination with neighboring clubs. He mentioned the existence of "Leader Members" in each club whose role it is to act as a liaison between the club and the district board. Turns out that Bill Lairsey is our Leader Member. However,

he has not been given any direction from our district board.

David mentioned that there a recording of the March 13 meeting is available on the <u>District 1 website</u> that explains the AMA program which includes potential grant funds.

It appears to David that this outreach effort is becoming more of a priority of AMA and District 1 in particular. He encouraged our members to check out the meeting video mentioned above and promised to pass along additional information as it becomes available.

General Club Outreach: As a continuation of the AMA Outreach topic, there was a long discussion about how we might coordinate event promotion with the other clubs in our neighborhood. Listings in our newsletter (see the information to the right) as well as on our website will help the matter. Also, passing event info to the District 1 website was mentioned.

Member Involvement: John Thibault raised the question about if we were doing enough to encourage our own member participation in meetings and events. The idea of adding Zoom coverage of member meetings was floated. The subject was tabled for future discussion.

Orphan Model Rescue: David solicited ideas for creating a formal district-wide program to "rescue" models that were in need of a new home. These are the planes and kits owned by modelers who have passed away or are no longer in the hobby. There was discussion of the dollar-value of these planes versus the nostalgic value. Bill Lairsey suggested directing people towards Ebay or RC Groups and RC Universe to see if their planes could be sold in those venues. Dave Cyr mentioned the many swap meets in the district including our own.

Club Documents: David confirmed that our AMA club charter and Leader Club certificates have been received. Also, received was our insurance certificates for Propsnappers Field (Green Road) and the Kiwanis Beach (Float-Fly events). Both have been distributed to the folks that need them for their files.

Field Maintenance: Dan Desena wanted input about the effectiveness of the vole treatment he has been administering for the past couple of years. He floated the idea of taking a year off to save the money and to see if it made a difference. We decided to continue the treatments out of concern that we may end up with a bigger problem. The needed amount of topsoil for filling the vole holes was also discussed. Dan indicated that he would send the loam ordering and delivery details to David for him to decide next steps prior to the Clean-Up Day.

The 3/4" thick HDPE product is made for marine use and should be a permanent solution for us. Just handling it for installation you could tell that it is an extremely durable material. He supplied it cut-to-size (30" x48") so it was all set for us to mount it on the existing base.

A full sheet of this material is super expensive even at *wholesale* pricing, so we certainly could never afford such a top-of-the-line product without Jake's thoughtful consideration.
