CALL TO ORDER: 9AM

Members Minutes: David called for approval of the member meeting minutes for April 2025meeting. The minutes were approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report: In Ed's absence, David reviewed April 2025 financial statement for the members present. The statement was approved as submitted. Current roster stands at 34 paid members.

Secretary's Report: There was no secretary's report.

President's Comments: David opened the meeting by thanking all involved for the spring field maintenance work and preparation for todays event. He also thanked James Ingalls for bringing his tractor to the field to move the loam and pull the roller. David suggested that James make a note on his yearly calendar as that is a lifetime responsibility. He thanked Simon for servicing the tractor and trimmer.

The Swap Meet was a wet one and f or the most part a wash, however a few deals were made

David discussed the club's financial sustainability with current membership levels. He will ask Ed to prepare some visual graphs/charts with regards to membership levels, average seasonal expense, comparison to varying member count.

The Propsnappers need 50 members each season to sustain the present quality of the club and allow for the rebuilding of the board reserves to pay for large capital expenses as they arise. In May of 2024 we had 40 paid members, this year we have 35! Public outreach, a membership drive and contacting lapsed members was all discussed.

Our Spring Float Fly is coming up in a couple weeks. David will contact Peter Pappas to confirm his availability with the rescue boat. He will also contact Eva at the Kiwanis to confirm all arrangements.

Safety Officer Report: John Thibault noted there were no safety concerns reported over the 2024 season. He reviewed the location and use of emergency numbers including the "Fly Away" procedure. He reminded everyone of the first aid kit location and content. Everyone was encouraged to speak up when seeing any safety violations so they may be addressed in a positive way. "Safety is everyone business."

Training Officer Report: Bill Lairsey noted that new member Brian Cohen is our single active student at this time. Pete Sarvas is the instructor.

JUST A REMINDER

Entrance Gate Procedure

MONDAY THRU FRIDAY - We are permitted to keep the gate swung open while we are flying from 8:00AM to 4:00PM. Last one out closes and locks the gate.

ON WEEKENDS - The gate must be swung closed but left unlocked by putting the chain over the gate.

In either situation, make sure the padlock itself <u>is locked</u> on the chain so it does not disappear. Thanks!
