FROM THE PRESIDENT

View from the Flight Deck

I know that crashing planes is part of the learning curve we all go through. From the number of times I have crashed, I hope that I am approaching the top of that impressive curve and can (for the most part) go home with my plane intact. There is no doubt that I am learning

how to repair foam planes, and that is good. Necessity being the mother of invention!

Another critical aspect of flying (beyond the manipulation of the flight controls) is awareness of my plane's position in relation to the surrounding environment. Things such as trees or my model's position as I line up a final approach. These are other aspects of flying that I am improving upon.

One thing I had not considered as a factor is my attention span and how quickly my old brain can react when I'm in trouble. I have problems holding attention and can become easily distracted. This season I've noticed that I will step to the flight line with a plan to practice touch and goes or flying the pattern with two or three landings. What transpired was less disciplined then hoped and often resulted in a stall close to

the ground following some failed attempt at an aerobatic loop, roll or even trimming the plane.

Many of us have had issues holding our attention while flying at one time or another and crashed as a result. However, my attention problems are unique to me, and I need to develop ways of keeping focused while flying. That said, there is one simple strategy we can do as a club.

When a pilot steps to the flight line to prepare for takeoff, he or she should be alone unless he/she is required to have a spotter or requests a support person. This is not a time for someone to begin a conversation or give last minute advice, as well intentioned as it may be. We should be totally focused on our flight plan, and for me that requires some deep relaxing breaths to clear my mind. I tend to turn off my car radio when I get into a tight traffic situation for the same reason, I need to concentrate on the matter at hand. Airlines over the years have realized that any nonessential discussion in the cockpit when the crew lands or takes-off increases the chances of an incident.

I know we can't have a formal rule about this because we all enjoy talking and supporting one another at the field. However, please be mindful that when a pilot is preparing to fly or in flight, they need their undivided attention to be on their plane.

Finally, I want to thank all of you for another successful season. Our Fall Fun-Fly (no surprise) was a lot of fun. Weather conditions were in flux as a front moved through, but we were left with clear skies and acceptable winds. We had 7 guests who enjoyed some flying and our hospitality. It was a fine event. Thanks to Bill Lairsey for managing the food and to all the club members who helped make the day enjoyable.

Entrance Gate Procedure

MONDAY THRU FRIDAY - We are permitted to keep the gate swung open while we are flying from 8:00AM to 4:00PM. Last one out closes and locks the gate.

ON WEEKENDS - The gate must be swung closed but left unlocked by putting the chain over the gate.

In either situation, make sure the padlock itself <u>is locked</u> on the chain so it does not disappear. Thanks!
